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Introduction

This document details population and household information relevant to the Erskine and Inchinnan multi-member electoral ward sourced from Scotland's Census 2011, published by the National Records of Scotland in various releases since 2012. The document is split into seven sections: General Population, Equality and Human Rights, Marital and Civil Partnership Status, Economic Activity, Household Information, Transport, and Health and Care.

Summary

- Erskine and Inchinnan is situated to the North East of Renfrewshire and shares borders with the Bishopton, Bridge of Weir and Langbank, Houston, Crosslee and Linwood, Paisley North West and Renfrew North wards.
- The ward incorporates the town of Erskine and village of Inchinnan, and features the Park Mains High School, Inchinnan Industrial Estate and the Erskine Bridge.
- Over 17,000 people live in the area, in slightly more than 7,000 households.
- There are more females (51.67%) in the ward than males (48.33%).
- Less than 2% of the ward's population are from a minority-ethnic group; over one-third of the population identify with the Church of Scotland.
- Less than 1% of the population have skills in Gaelic.
- Over half of all people aged 16 and over are married.
- There is more economic activity in the ward than across Renfrewshire.
- At the time of the census the main employment industries were wholesale and retail trade, human health and social work activities, and manufacturing.
- Overall qualifications are higher than Renfrewshire, with females gaining higher qualifications than males.
- Approximately 87% of all households in Erskine and Inchinnan are detached, semi-detached or terraced houses, with over 80% of all households owning either outright or with a mortgage their household residence.
- There are lower proportions of lone parent unemployment for both men (26.47%) and women (26.77%) but particularly for women than across the whole of Renfrewshire (33.5% and 44.3% respectively).
- There are proportionately fewer deprived households than across Renfrewshire.
- Approximately 84% of people believe they have 'Very Good or Good Health'
- 71% of people have no long-term health conditions.
- Approximately 11% of people provide unpaid care.

Section One – General Population

Table 1 illustrates the total number of households and the total number of people living in Erskine and Inchinnan. There are over 7,000 households in the ward, which equates to 8.68% of the total number of households in Renfrewshire. There are more than 17,000 people that live in the ward, equating to nearly 10% of the Renfrewshire population.

Following on from this, Table 2 illustrates the total number of males and females in Erskine and Inchinnan against the Renfrewshire totals. The table highlights that there is a near identical representation of males and females concentrated in the ward compared with the Renfrewshire average.

Erskine and Inchinnan has a higher proportion of children and young people aged 5 to 19 than the whole of Renfrewshire, but a smaller proportion of 20 to 29 year olds. There are a slightly higher proportion of 30 to 64 year olds in the ward, but an overall smaller proportion of adults aged over 65.

This is further highlighted in Table 4; almost 14% of people in Erskine and Inchinnan are aged 5 to 15, compared to 12% throughout Renfrewshire, while there is a smaller proportion of people aged 65 to 74 and 75 and over concentrated within the ward.

Table 5 illustrated the total working-age population of Erskine and Inchinnan against the whole of Renfrewshire. This shows that there are a slightly higher proportion of working-age adults between 16 and 64 in the ward because there are proportionally more 16 to 17 year olds. There is a slightly smaller proportion of 16 to 74 year olds compared with the Renfrewshire average.

In Table 6, five-year age bands of all people in Erskine and Inchinnan are illustrated, separated by gender. There are more people in the 40 to 45 age band in the ward than in any other age band (1,445). In every age band from age 25 onwards, there are more females than males, while across Renfrewshire this is the case from age 30. The age band with the closest split between the male and female populations in the ward is 0 to 4, with 50.71 males compared to 49.29% females. This equates to 464 males and 451 females.

To summarise, there is a similar proportion of working-age people in Erskine and Inchinnan compared with the rest of Renfrewshire, while there are proportionately more young people (aged under 18) than the whole of Renfrewshire.

Section Two – Ethnicity and Religion

Erskine and Inchinnan has a diverse mix yet smaller proportion of ethnic groups than the rest of Renfrewshire. Less than 2% of the ward's population are from a minority ethnic group, with white people making up 98.47% of the population. Table 7 shows that over 1% of people in the ward are of an Asian background, although this is smaller than the Renfrewshire average. Tables 8.1 and 8.2 develop this further, by looking at the total number of males and females and their age bands across each ethnic group.

Erskine and Inchinnan have a higher proportion of people that identify with the Church of Scotland, and a lower number of Roman Catholics compared with the Renfrewshire average. Other religious groups are generally similar or slightly smaller in proportion to the rest of Renfrewshire.

Section Three – Marital and Civil Partnership Status

The majority of people aged 16 and over in Erskine and Inchinnan are married (53.57%) compared to 44% of the total Renfrewshire population. Table 11 indicates that there are lower proportions of single, separated, divorced or widowed people in the ward compared with the whole of Renfrewshire. Tables 12.1 and 12.2 illustrate the total number of males and females across each category, split into age bands.

The tables show that people aged 16 and over in Erskine and Inchinnan are more likely to be married than not. Approximately 51% of all females in the ward are married compared to 56% of males. There are a higher proportion of single males in the ward (32%) than there are females (27%).

Section Four – Economic Activity

Tables 13 to 15 highlight the number of working age people across Erskine and Inchinnan by their level of economic activity, industry and occupation in the week leading up to the 2011 Census. Should you seek the most up to date picture, details can be found at <http://www.nomisweb.co.uk/>.

The Census defines Economic Activity as “*whether or not a person aged 16 and over was working or looking for work in the week before census. Rather than a simple indicator of whether or not someone was currently in employment, it provides a measure of whether or not a person was an active participant in the labour market.*”¹

Across Erskine and Inchinnan over 45% of people aged 16 to 74 were in full-time employment, which is higher than the Renfrewshire average (41.13%). There was a lower rate of unemployment in the ward than there was across Renfrewshire, although there was a slightly higher than average proportion of full-time students in Erskine and Inchinnan than the whole of Renfrewshire. The ward is more economically active (73.09%) than the whole of Renfrewshire (68.74%); there are more men in full-time employment than women, while there are more women in part-time employment or at home looking after the family than men.

Industries that employed the most working age people in Erskine and Inchinnan are wholesale and retail trade, human health and social activities, and manufacturing. Industries where the Erskine and Inchinnan population were under-represented compared to the Renfrewshire total were accommodation and food services, human health and social work activities, and construction. There was over-representation of people in the ward that work in manufacturing and financial and insurance activities.

Following on from industry, Table 15 indicated the occupation of working age people in Erskine and Inchinnan. The most common occupation for people in the ward was professional occupations, which was also the most-common occupation throughout Renfrewshire. Approximately 7% of people in the ward worked as process, plant or machine operators, compared to approximately 8% throughout Renfrewshire; this was the least common occupation for all people.

Levels of education qualifications across Erskine and Inchinnan are generally higher in proportion than the Renfrewshire totals. However, there are a lower proportion of people aged 16 and over in the ward with a Degree level qualification than there is throughout Renfrewshire.

This is explored further in Table 16.2 which highlights that there are more females than males in the ward obtaining qualifications at Levels 3 and 4. However, there are also a higher proportion of females with no qualifications than males. Almost 1,000 females aged 35 to 49 have Level 3 or 4 qualifications, compared with approximately 750 males of the same age group.

Section Five – Household Information

The most common type of household in Erskine and Inchinnan is married couple households with no dependent children, amounting to 31.42% of all households in the ward. The proportion of married couple households with or without dependent children (52.73%) is much greater in this ward than the average across Renfrewshire (38.37%). However, it can also be said that there is a much lower proportion of one adult households in the ward than there is throughout the whole of Renfrewshire.

There are a total of 501 lone parent households in Erskine and Inchinnan, 34 male and 467 female. Table 21 shows that a higher proportion of lone parents are in full-time employment within the ward than there are across the whole of Renfrewshire, which leads to a lower proportion of lone parents that are unemployed in Erskine and Inchinnan compared to the Renfrewshire average – particularly female lone parents of which there is a significantly lower proportion not in employment.

2. Education: no person aged 16 to 64 in the household has a highest level qualification of level 2 or above, or no person aged 16 to 18 is a full-time student.
3. Health and disability: any person in the household has 'bad' or 'very bad' general health, or has a long-term limiting health problem or disability.
4. Housing: the household's accommodation is either overcrowded (with an occupancy rating of -1 or less), is in a shared dwelling or does not have central heating.

Section Six - Transport

The most common method of transport used by working age people of Erskine and Inchinnan with two out of three people doing so is driving a car or van. This is proportionally 7% higher than across the whole of Renfrewshire. Other modes of transport to work are generally lower than the Renfrewshire averages with taking a train and on foot having the largest differences.
