Your weekly coronavirus update

The Scottish Government has announced that current restrictions on the hospitality industry are set to continue until 2

November when a new strategic 'tiered approach' to tackling the virus will be introduced.

The enhanced measures in place across central Scotland including Renfrewshire, will also continue for now. This means all restaurants and pubs will stay closed along with snooker, pool, bowling and bingo halls.


Hotels are permitted to serve food to resident guests and cafes can operate without alcohol until 6pm.

Details on the new tiered approach will be released in the coming days and the First Minister, Nicola Sturgeon, has stated the government cannot rule out tougher restrictions. However, these will be continuously assessed and balanced by the wider impacts they are likely to have on the economy and people's wellbeing.
