

Southholm Roundabout Cycle Infrastructure Improvements



Consultation Leaflet

Following a recent study published by Sustrans Scotland, the Southholm Roundabout (A726/ Parkway/ Old Greenock Road), was found to be one of Scotland's junctions most in need of extra safety measures specific to cyclists.

Local Transport Projects, on behalf of Renfrewshire Council, are currently undertaking a safety assessment of the junction. A range of potential improvement options will then be developed with the aim of providing a safer and more attractive environment for walking and cycling through the junction. Any improvement measures to be implemented at the junction will be designed to tie into plans for the wider cycling and walking route networks.

This study is being funded by Sustrans Scotland as part of the Tackling Dangerous Junctions Programme which seeks to redesign junctions to make them safer for people cycling. This project also aims to provide walking and cycling infrastructure that supports everyday journeys on foot and by bike, particularly short journeys to work and to school.



We would like to hear your views regarding any issues that currently exist and what improvements you would like to see at the junction. When responding we would ask you to consider the following questions:

1. As a motorist, cyclist or pedestrian, have you experienced any issues or difficulties when travelling through the junction?
2. Do you have any other concerns or issues which you would like to see addressed as part of the project?
3. What improvements would you like to see at the junction?
4. Have you any other comments?
